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## Prosper to hold second Comp Plan Town Hall meeting *Committee anxious to share draft of new plan with residents*

PROSPER (January 26, 2012) Prosper residents will get another chance to talk about the Town's future as Prosper hosts the second Town Hall Meeting regarding the evolving Comprehensive Plan, according to Chris Copple, Planning Director.

The meeting is set for 6:30 p.m. on Monday, Feb. 13 at the same location as the first meeting, the Prosper High School cafeteria, 301 Eagle Drive, and is hosted by the Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee (CPAC).

"The purpose of the meeting is to present the draft Comprehensive Plan that the CPAC has developed over the past seven months. The input received at the Town Hall meeting held last June guided the committee as it worked with consultant, Freese & Nichols, to draft the new plan. We're strongly encouraging Prosper residents to download and review the draft, so they're better able to share their thoughts and comments at the February 13 meeting," said Copple.

Refreshments and registration will open the meeting at 6:30 p.m. and the presentation and discussion will commence at 7 p.m. The draft of the Comprehensive Plan will be the center of discussion, as officials are seeking reactions and input on it. "The Comprehensive Plan will guide future growth and evaluate future land use, housing, transportation, infrastructure, economics and community character. We're hoping to get as much input as we can, since this is the time when citizens can really make a difference in the Town's future," said Copple.

Attendance at the first meeting last summer is not a pre-requisite to attending and participating in the upcoming meeting. That initial Town Hall meeting attracted over 140 residents and officials are hoping for even greater participation in February.

"Active citizen involvement and participation are key to the success of the plan," concluded Copple.

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**ABOUT THE TOWN OF PROSPER** – The Town of Prosper is a fast-growing suburb with small town charm, located 30 miles north of Dallas at the crossroads of U.S. 380, Preston Road and the Dallas North Tollway in Collin and Denton Counties. Prosper sits on 27 square miles and is home to more than 10,000 people. A home-rule municipality, governed by a council-manager form of government, the town has full-time fire and police departments, including its own dispatch service.
