## Prosper Inspections announces Builder of the Year

PROSPER (May 20, 2011) The Town's Inspections Division has released the name of the 2010 Builder of the Year along with two runners up, according to Wayne Snell, Prosper's Building Official.

"Our department is extremely pleased to recognize the builders that exemplify the kind of craftsmanship and attention to detail that our residents deserve and expect. Our inspectors find that, for the most part, builders who come to Prosper to conduct their business do so in a skilled and professional manner," he said.

The 2010 Builder of the Year is Mark Covington with Drees Custom Homes. The first runner-up is Gary Castleberry with Dave R. Williams Homes, and the second runner-up is Brian Boyd with Highland Homes.

The three were chosen from among a field of candidates who were all nominated for the honor based on the quality of work in the building industry, consistency in being ready for inspection when called for, minimal number of code violations during inspection process, and productivity and excellence of work done by each builder.

"The three finalists and their eventual ranking were determined by members of the Town's Building Inspection team. As in all previous years that we've had this award, the competition was at a very high level. The three awardees were among a solid group of builders who continue to strive for the highest in their industry," said Snell.

The winner will be recognized at the May 24 meeting of the Town Council and will receive a plaque commemorating his accomplishment.
