Town of Prosper announces holiday schedule

PROSPER (December 10, 2010) Owing to the fact that Christmas Day and New Years Day are both Saturdays this season, the Town of Prosper has made associated changes in their usual closure schedule, according to Utility Billing Clerk Kelly Vanaman.

Offices will close on Thursday, Dec 23, Friday, Dec. 24 and Friday, Dec 31. There will, however, be no change in weekly trash collection service. Residents should follow their normal trash and recycling procedure through the holidays.

A change has been made, though, on the monthly scheduled bulk trash collection. The normal bulk trash pickup day is the last Saturday of the month; this year Christmas falls on that day. Therefore, for this month only, the bulk trash pickup will be moved to the third Saturday of the month, Dec. 18. All other procedures for bulk trash pickup remain in effect.

Also, the Town is providing a Christmas tree drop off point in place of curbside pickup. Natural Christmas trees without ornaments, lights, garland, tinsel or other adornments may be dropped off at the parking lot immediately south of Town Hall. The lot serves as overflow parking for the municipal building and is adjacent to 201 S. Main St. The drop off is in effect from Jan. 1 to Jan. 16, 2011. Flocked trees will not be accepted at the site, and must be either wrapped in plastic or sealed in a plastic bag and left curbside for normal pickup.
