Key Dates for General Election – May 14, 2011

February 14, 2011 – First day to file an application for a place on the ballot

Applications may not be “dropped off” at Town Hall. Applications must be accepted in person by the Town Secretary or by a designated representative. Applications “dropped off” and not personally accepted will be returned.

March 14, 2011 – Deadline to file an application for a place on ballot

Applications must be “in-hand” by 5 p.m. Mailed applications must be received by 5 p.m., not postmarked by 5 p.m.

March 22, 2011 – Last day for a candidate to withdraw application for a place on the ballot

Withdrawal must be received in writing by 5 p.m.

April 14, 2011 – Last day to register to vote in order to be able to vote in May 14, 2011 election

May 2, 2011 – Early voting by personal appearance begins from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

May 2 through Saturday May 7, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., and extended hours on May 9 and 10 from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Early Voting locations will be at Prosper Municipal Chambers at 108 W. Broadway Street, and the Collin County Elections Office at 2010 Redbud Blvd, #102, McKinney, Texas.

May 10, 2011 – Last day to vote early by personal appearance.

May 14, 2011 – ELECTION DAY 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Voting will take place at the Prosper Community Library

ABOUT THE TOWN OF PROSPER – The Town of Prosper is a fast-growing suburb with small town charm, located 30 miles north of Dallas at the crossroads of U.S. 380, Preston Road and the Dallas North Tollway in Collin and Denton Counties. Prosper sits on 27 square miles and is home to more than 9,000 people. A home-rule municipality, governed by a council-manager form of government, the town has full-time fire and police departments, including its own dispatch service.
