

Prosper Citizen's Police Academy Alumni Association (PCPA3) – Our mission is to present & promote a continuing positive image of all law enforcement, to promote goodwill between the community and the Prosper Police Department, to plan, originate, aid, and/or assist the police department, the Town, and the citizens in promoting and supporting civic projects and programs for the betterment of the community and its citizens.

Prosper Citizen's On Patrol (C.O.P) – is a non-confrontational neighborhood program designed to reduce crime through the increased cooperation between citizens and police. Volunteers donate their time to patrol designated areas by driving vehicles provided by the community organization. They are trained by the Prosper Police Department to observe, recognize, and report suspicious or criminal activity.

The C.O.P. program allows citizens to take an active role in crime prevention, by acting as the eyes and ears of the police department. It builds camaraderie between the residents of the Town, by creating a safer environment and a better quality of life. It also sends a message that the citizens are aware, alert, and will not tolerate criminal activity.

Volunteers In Police Service (V.I.P.S) - is a program which provides support and resources for the Town of Prosper Police Department and enhances volunteerism for community members who wish to volunteer their time and skills.

The VIPS program will direct volunteer opportunities within the police department and direct the placement of volunteers in order to maximize their talents in service of the community. Volunteer opportunities exist for a wide variety of services which include anything from data entry to helping put together a budget for the department. VIPS will also help with special events such as the Country Christmas and the Health and Safety Fair.

Both COPs and VIPS require graduation from the CPA and additional COPS/VIPS training.
