
Prosper Well Represented at Ceremony

Frontier Park North Field Improvements

At the May 10, 2016, Town Council meeting, staff was asked to bring back the 3-plex field sizes to the Council. At their May 31, 2016, meeting, Town Council gave staff direction to design the northwest and southwest fields with an outfield of 275' with artificial turf. Staff continues to evaluate artificial turf options and is working to develop a Request for Proposals (RFP) to send out to receive competitive bids for a turn-key artificial turf installation.

Non-Urban Texas Parks & Wildlife Grant

Staff travelled to Austin for a Texas Parks and Wildlife grant workshop to discuss the grant process.

PARK OPERATIONS



Main Street

Removed bleachers and shade structures.

General

Sprayed all medians.

First Street/Coit/Prosper Trail - fertilized medians on Preston Road.

Coit Road - Plant (at least one flowerbed) petunias to gauge number of plants needed to complete.

Greenspoint

Sidewalk cleanup (cut back tree limbs overhanging sidewalk).

Pecan Grove

Tree limbs, shape up tree trunks, pickup piles of limbs.

Patin Property

Built a fence at the Patin property and cleaned the brush pile.



RECREATION SERVICES

Archery

Session II Spring classes wrapped up on May 19, 2016. Classes were held Thursdays from 4:00-4:45pm and 4:50-5:35pm. Archery II finished with 11 students registered.

Camp Gladiator

Classes continue on Monday and Friday from 9:15-0:15am and Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 5:15-6:15am. The Frontier Park location has 62 members registered to attend classes.

Fit4Mom

Classes continue at Frontier Park on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9:30-10:30am. Fit 4 Mom had 8 participants plus their children for May.

Mayor's Coffee

Staff hosted the annual Mayor's Coffee on May 18, 2016, from 9:30-11am at Municipal Chambers. Twenty-one active adults attended.



Spring Men's Adult Softball

The Spring Adult Softball season was rescheduled due to inclement weather. Final games were played on June 9, 2016. Registration was open for the summer league until June 8, 2016.

Tennis Programs

Spring classes wrapped up on May 20, 2016. Session II (April 20-May 20) with team practices Sunday afternoons: Quickstart I : 15 registered; Quickstart II: 36 registered; Tournament: 8 registered; and USTA Junior Team Tennis: 19 registered. Tennis had a total of 78 players.

Summer Recreational Activities

All summer programs have been entered into the recreation software and are open for enrollment. Staff created a marketing plan that partners with the Prosper Community Library and a total of 7,500 post cards were mailed to Prosper residents announcing the summer programming options. Registration was positively affected by the mailing. Summer programs include Archery, Bricks 4 Kidz, Bowman Sport Camps, Engineering for Kids, and Tennis camps. Adult programming will continue with the addition of DDP Yoga starting June 2, 2016.
