

## Frontier Park North Field Improvements - Artificial Turf

Artificial turf proposals were submitted on September 6, 2016. Designs are 50% complete. The CMAR is estimated to give a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) in late October 2016 based on 100% completion of the drawings. Construction is estimated to begin the end of the year.
