



MAYOR SETS UP FITNESS FORCE '16

Mayor Ray Smith is asking Prosper residents to join FITNESS FORCE '16 by pledging to walk, jog, run, bike or swim more than 100 miles between January 15 and April 15. To join the Mayor in this initiative, download a Mileage Tracking Sheet from www.ProsperParksandRec.org or www.ProsperTx.gov and begin logging miles.



FITNESS FORCE '16 is presented in conjunction with a Texas statewide competition called the "It's Time Texas Community Challenge."

Presented by grocer H-E-B, this challenge mobilizes residents to compete with municipalities of similar size in celebration of healthy living.

Mayor Smith has registered at www.ITTCCommunityChallenge.com and signed the "Mayor's Pledge in support of the Texas competition. He encourages all FITNESS FORCE '16 partners to register and log activity, as well. Doing so from now through March 31 will earn points for Prosper and potential national recognition.

The deadline to return FITNESS FORCE '16 Mileage Tracking Sheets is April 15. Sheets may be dropped off at the Parks and Rec Department or scanned and emailed to julie_shivers@prospertx.org by April 15.

7th ANNUAL TROUT DERBY

Prosper's next community event will be at the pond at Frontier Park on Saturday, February 27, from 9-11am. Kids, parents and grandparents are invited to come out to the park for an all-American morning! There will be fishing and time to create memories and "fish stories" to last for years to come.

The event is free of charge and prizes in various categories will be awarded to boys and girls, ages 14 and younger.

If your child or grandchild would like to participate, please pre-register at www.ProsperParksandRec.org so plans can be made accordingly. Those 17 years of age and older should visit www.TPWF.org (Texas Parks and Wildlife website) for licensing rules to avoid a citation.

The pond will be stocked by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department with rainbow trout and also a few copper nose bluegill, channel catfish, hybrid crappie and largemouth bass.

The tournament is a catch-and-keep event for trout only; Derby officials encourage catch-and-release for other species.

Fish are provided by the Town of Prosper. State fishing regulations concerning licenses and other rules apply before and after the tournament.
