

## **Fire Pit/Fire Feature Permit Submittal**

### **Definitions:**

- **Fire Feature:** an outdoor gas appliance that has a gas burner and lava rocks and glass; the outdoor open-air equivalent of an indoor non-wood burning fireplace with gas logs.
- **Fire Pit:** a pit dug into the ground or encased in a surrounding structure (as of masonry or steel) that is designed to contain a **wood-burning** fire and prevent it from spreading.

### **Required Submittal Documents:**

#### **ENERGOV SUBMITTAL TYPE: ACCESSORY**

1. **OSSF permit from Collin County Development Services (CCDS):** required if property has septic.
2. **Site Plan (Survey).**
  - Location of the proposed fire pit/fire feature
  - Distances to all adjacent property lines and any combustible items (reference Specific Requirements #1 below)
3. **Construction Plan.**
  - Dimensions of the fire pit/fire feature
    - A **wood burning fire pit** shall have a maximum burn bowl area (where the wood is put) of 36" diameter and 24" in height.
    - A fire feature may exceed these dimensions if manufacturer specifications allow for larger.
  - Clearly indicate if gas is to be run to the fire pit/fire feature.

### **Specific Requirements:**

1. Clearance to Combustibles (Fire Department requirement):
  - Fire pits shall have 10' clearance to combustibles (wall of house, **wooden fence**, arbors, accessory buildings, etc.) measured from the inside edge of the fire pit.
  - A fire feature may have clearances reduced if the manufacturer's installation guide specifically states as such. Manufacturer installation guide shall be provided for reduced clearances.
2. Fire pits/fire features are required to be a minimum 3' from any adjacent property line.
3. If property is a Key lot: shall comply with required building setbacks adjacent to side street.
4. Manufactured outdoor decorative appliance shall be listed in accordance with ANSI Z21.97.
